Jay Cross, CEO at [Internet Time Group](#) and founder of the [Workflow Institut](#), is a renown pioneer in the field of informal learning, web 2.0, and thought leader who coined the very term 'eLearning'. He has challenged traditional ideas about adult education for more than three decades, ever since his very first business degree program at the University of Phoenix. The Harvard and Princeton University graduate is a frequent keynote speaker and chairman at conferences and was CEO of the eLearning Forum. Jay is author of [Informal Learning: Rediscovering the Natural Pathways that Inspire Innovation and Performance](#) and [Learnscaping: How to Get Things Done in Organizations](#) and thousand read his Internet Time Blog daily. Jay is a sought-after consultant for implementing informal/ web 2.0 learning strategies to foster virtual team collaboration and accelerate performance in global enterprises.

[Heike's enthusiasm for synchronous Internet communication](#) also led her to co-initiate yet another European funded project: [AVALON](#). AVALON stands for [Access to Virtual and Action Learning live Online](#) and is about language learning in Second Life, a 3D virtual world and with a consortium of 26 European partners, 11 of which are Universities. She is a frequent speaker at the Online Educa, EUROCALL, WIAOC, LearnTec and Illinois Online Conference about language learning in virtual classrooms.
